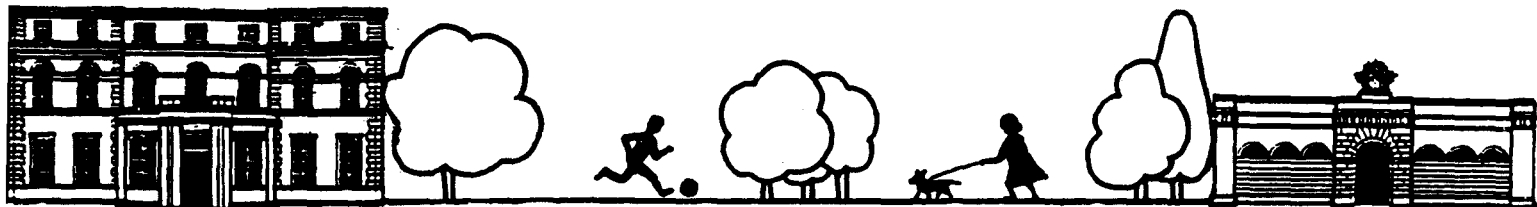

## THE A.G.M. AND THE PARK WALK

## THE ANNE FRANK CONCERT

On May 2nd we held a fund-raising concert to help finance the Anne Frank exhibition. It was an enormous success and we must thank everybody who came and who worked to make it succeed.

On Saturday 13th April, using the labour of Friends volunteers and eight students from Hounslow Borough College, we repainted the whole of the Small Mansion Lecture Room (ceiling, walls and radiators) and washed down the adjacent rooms and the Lecture Room floor - in one day. It looked amazingly good afterwards. We didn't!

Then on the concert evening the 5 young women of the Onyx Wind Quintet arrived in good time, practiced in the room to get the sound right and treated us to a wonderful programme. All 75 seats were occupied and the enthusiasm of the audience - and the players - swirled round the room until it was time to set off across the Park at 10.30. The players were students from the Royal Academy of Music; they were really professional, from the choice of music to the quality of their playing.

We made a donation of £500 to the Anne Frank exhibition. Basil Mann was delighted with this gift - and with the huge sum raised (mainly by Terry Martin's hard work) in the raffle of a painting. The number of visitors to the exhibition has been very large and the demand from schools has been so great that it was extended for a further two weeks. Basil Mann and the staff of the museum deserve the greatest praise for their work. We are proud to have been able to help. It has been an important exhibition for Gunnersbury - and for west London.
