

SPECIAL MEETING ON THE RESTORATION PROJECT, Saturday 26 November

Members of the project team planning the restoration programme for Gunnersbury Park and Museum have agreed to come to a special meeting to discuss the project with members of the Friends.

The group includes Hounslow and Ealing officers who are coordinating the work of a series of expert consultants and drafting the applications for funding which will be submitted to the Heritage Lottery Fund and other bodies. This meeting is an important opportunity to hear how the proposals are developing and what the programme is going to be for submitting the funding applications and, if successful, for implementing the works.

Gunnersbury's Victorian kitchens will be decked with holly and ivy to put you in the Christmas spirit. You can help the servants pound the sugar and spices, stir the plum pudding and make a Christmas wish!

You might also discover a few Christmas traditions . . . For example, why is the pudding stirred from east to west? Why does the recipe for mince pies include three spices? And who are the Lord and Lady of Misrule?
